## OPEN TENDER

Always use an open tender when landing on a seabird island and check for signs of stowaways before launching



## 6 RAT GUARDS

Use rat guards on mooring lines and anchor chains



## SPREAD THE WORD

Display biosecurity advice for passengers onboard

## 1 CHECK YOUR HULL

Deploy chew cards or wax chew blocks - check them regularly for signs of stowawavs



## LUGGAGE

Repack luggage before boarding and never leave unattended on harbour side



## CARGO

Pack cargo in rodent proof containers and check for signs of stowaways before boarding



## WASTE

Store waste securely in rodent proof bins and dispose regularly using waste disposal facilities

- **DO NOT** LAND ON A SEABIRD ISLAND
- NEVER PUSH STOWAWAYS
  OVERBOARD DEAD OR ALIVE!

Rodents and other small mammals can swim many kilometres

- **DO NOT** ASSUME ONLY ONE INDIVIDUAL STOWAWAY IS ABOARD
- OD RETURN TO A
  MAINLAND HARBOUR
